

Faculty Athletics Representative

The Faculty Athletic Representative (FAR) is an NCAA-mandated position appointed by and reporting directly to the President. The FAR is one of five University representatives authorized to directly contact the NCAA. The Faculty Athletic Representative will have a strong commitment to supporting the NCAA Division III philosophy, especially seeking "to establish and maintain an environment in which a student-athlete's athletics activities are conducted as an integral part of the student-athlete's educational experience, and an environment that values cultural diversity and gender equity among their student-athletes and athletics staff." (http://www.ncaa.org/governance/division-iii-philosophy-statement).

Duties:

The FAR's primary responsibilities are to support and help to ensure the academic integrity of the University's Division III athletics program, serve as a liaison between the athletics program and academic affairs and the faculty, and serve as an independent advocate for student—athlete wellbeing.

Specific duties include:

- 1. Working with the Director of Athletics and the coaches, monitor academic performance of student-athletes, including delivery of academic services.
- 2. Work with the athletics compliance director to ensure student-athlete eligibility.
- 3. Serve as a liaison between the athletics department and the faculty; this includes bringing faculty/academic concerns to the athletics department, providing faculty with updates and information about the athletics program; working with faculty, the UFC, Deans, Provost, and other constituencies to address concerns about and develop ways to support student athletes.
- 4. Serve as senior faculty advisor on athletics to the President; meet regularly with the President.
- 5. Provide counsel to the Director of Athletics and the Vice President for Student Affairs; meet regularly with each.
- 6. Work with the Director of Athletics and staff to identify faculty liaisons for each varsity sport team; coordinate the communication between the athletics department and the faculty liaisons for each team.
- 7. Review annual Institutional Research survey of athletes and address issues with the Director of Athletics.

- 8. Serve as a member of the Athletics Leadership Team, attend regular Athletics staff meetings, meet with Student-Athlete Advisory Committee; Chair the Intercollegiate Athletics Advisory Committee.
- 9. Attend NCAA Division III new FAR Orientation (Oct. 31-Nov. 2 in Baltimore); attend NCAA convention (January 23-25, Orlando, Fla.)
- 10. Attend athletic conference meetings (1/semester).
- 11. Participate on 2018-2019 search committee for the new Director of Athletics; serve on search committees for senior athletics department administrators and head coaches as needed.
- 12. Be visible to student-athletes and staff through attendance at contests, events, etc.
- 13. Nominate student athletes for national recognitions and/or provide letters of support for same.

Qualifications:

- Tenured, full-time faculty member.
- Experience with collegiate athletics, including experience teaching/working with UMW athletes.
- Commitment to and ability to speak to the high impact, educational value of a student's participation in a high quality Division III athletics program, and how a quality Division III program fits with and advances our institutional mission and goals.

Compensation:

Annual stipend of \$3,000; one course release per academic year. This position has a three-year term; the FAR can be reappointed.

This position reports to the President.

Application Process:

Submit (1) a brief statement of interest and qualifications, including what you see as the primary goals of a Division III athletics program at a liberal arts institution; (2) current CV.

Applications will be reviewed by Nina Mikhalevsky, Provost and Juliette Landphair, Vice President for Student Affairs; the Provost and Vice President will make their recommendations to the President, President Paino will make the appointment.
